CROMWELL COMMUNITY OF LEARNING (COL) PROGRESS REPORT

- Mason Stretch (Principal of Cromwell College) is the Lead Principal of the CoL for 2021/2022.
- A second Across Kāhui Ako Lead Teacher has recently been appointed. Tineke Hayes has joined the team and will work in the area of wellbeing and community engagement alongside Shona Hamilton whose focus area is Literacy.
- Kāhui Ako application for Professional Learning support in the areas of wellbeing and PACT (Progress & Consistency Tool) for assessment was successful with 200 facilitation hours allocated to support these focus areas over the next 18 months.
- Three Bilingual Support Workers continue to support our ESOL students across the Kāhui Ako whose first languages are Portuguese, Tagalog and Afrikaans.

HEALTH & SAFETY NEWS

- Bus Students this week all bus students received a "Bus Code of Conduct" agreement to be shared with parents. Please take the time to go through the expectations for safe behaviour when travelling on school buses, sign the agreement and return it to the School Office or the class purple bag. At a meeting for all bus students, behaviour expectations, compulsory wearing of highlighter vests and what children should do if they see something happening on the bus that concerns them were all covered.
- Vaping this week we received a report of a college student offering two of our children a "vape" as they were walking home from school. We ask that all parents follow this up at home with a family discussion about what your child/ children should do when they are walking home from school and something like this happens.
- Good family rules for you to follow and/or share with your children to promote safety include:
- never accept a ride from a stranger, make sure a parent knows where you are at all times, don't reveal personal information to strangers (including online) and keep the door locked and don't answer it if you are home alone.
- "No, Go, Yell, Tell". These four words are part of the National Crime Prevention Council for teaching children about strangers. This phrase teaches children to yell "No!" if approached by strangers, run away quickly, yell for help and tell a trusted adult what happened. Even young children can learn these four words and what to do.
- Most children will grow up without having any trouble with strangers, but it's best to be prepared. Teach your children to be aware of the people around them and follow basic safety rules. Doing this will help them have confidence to know how to keep themselves safe. Start today!
