The school has been working on the building project for over several years now and after being disappointed with the outcome of a tender process involving the MOE in 2018, we have recently commenced a tender process with two local construction companies. We are hoping to have some good news about this project soon, as we know it will be a wonderful asset for both our school and wider community. This building will also provide a permanent base for the Cromwell Kids Fun Club (Holiday Programme). This year we will be putting the funds raised towards a new playground rope climbing rig.

- A DVD Evening “Most Likely to Succeed” – an edu-documentary about project based learning. Parents who attended were invited to share their ideas & concerns about where learning is heading, the place of technology, collaborative and modern learning environments.

We offer parents one more opportunity to provide feedback linked to the development of a new School Strategic Plan. A link will be shared next week (enjoy the short video made by the Student Councillors) and then complete the Google Survey. Your ideas and feedback will be appreciated by the BoT.
