What a lot we have packed into the past two weeks. Last week Learning Partnership Conferences provided a chance for students to share their learning with parents, celebrate progress and achievement of goals and discuss their next learning steps and how these are going to be achieved. As a Community of Learning we have been gathering data about parental engagement with their children's learning. Not all the class attendance data has been received from teachers yet but currently 78% of our parents have attended learning partnership conferences held last week.

We know your children really value and benefit from your interest and support and this provides a great opportunity to see what your child has been doing at school.

Cross Country events were held last week for both Year 3 at school and Years 4-6 at Butcher's Drive. Congratulations to all our children who participated with such a positive attitude and it was great to see them encouraging runners as they neared the finish line. Results have been included in today's newsletter. Fifteen of our Years 5/6 athletes participated in the Dunstan Zone Cross Country held in Clyde on Monday. Despite the cold weather there were some fantastic performances with ten out of our fifteen runners qualifying for the Central Otago Cross Country Championships scheduled for later this term.

BUILDING COMMUNITY PARTNERSHIPS

One of the key messages we heard at the New Pedagogies for Deep Learning (NPDL) Deep Learning Lab held in Christchurch during the term holidays was the importance of building strong community partnerships. At Cromwell Primary we work hard to connect with both our parent and wider community in a range of ways.

Cupcake Fundraiser: Every year the Student Council partners with the students from Otago Polytech for the Cupcake Fundraiser. This huge bake off has now become an assessment task for the polytech students and our councillors take on the administration of the fundraiser by advertising, taking orders, arranging collection and delivery of the cupcakes. It all went very well last Friday as 280 cupcakes were baked, decorated, packed and delivered to classrooms. Special thanks to the staff and students of Otago Polytech Catering Course, Atsuko Porteous who baked and donated our GF cupcakes and all the families who supported this fundraiser. We raised an amazing \$800 for Starship which is the school's chosen charity in 2019.



Iwi Partnership: Local Ngai Tahu Mentor Tim Riwahi from Alexandra has been working with our Kapa Haka boys over the past two weeks. Tim has introduced the boys to mau rākau (skilful use of weapons) and it has been amazing to see how quickly the boys have built up their skill levels. The girls have not been forgotten either, as they have been working hard with parent Lucy Fukofuka who has been teaching the girls a Pasifika Dance. We are excited that our polyfest performance at the Murihiku Polyfest in Invercargill on Wednesday 28 August will be a fusion of Māori and Pasifika Cultures and will include mau rākau. We hope to see their performance item at assembly before the group heads to Invercargill later this month.



Community Crusaders: This initiative is underway again this year with 25 keen Years 5/6 children really loving this opportunity to connect with elderly residents of Cromwell at Care & Friendship or Ripponburn Rest Home every Wednesday lunchtime. Thanks Mrs Huffadine, Mrs Thomlinson and the group of parents who have committed time to helping out with transport.

HEALTH & SAFETY NEWS

Winter illnesses continue to take their toll this term, with daily attendance numbers for students being affected. We have appreciated the support of parents who have kept sick children at home, including those displaying possible flu like symptoms. Next week, 110 Years 4-6 students have their first school ski trip to Cardrona. We have 24 parents volunteering their time to come and help, which is outstanding and will help to ensure a safe and happy day for all involved.

Thank you to parents who have attended Tuesday's Parent Helpers' Ski Briefing. The second briefing is Thursday at 7.30pm in Ako, for those who didn't make it on Tuesday. All parents are welcome.

Students will have their first safety briefing today. We ask that you reinforce at home the need for your child to be as responsible and cooperative as possible while on the mountain. Our main safety message to students is "We can only help keep you safe if you are helping to keep yourselves safe too!" That means listening and following instructions and being where they are expected to be.

- We aim to return by 5.15pm.
