IMMUNISATIONS

In response to the recent Measles outbreak, we are checking that the students' vaccination records that we hold, are up-to-date. Under the Health (Immunisation) Regulations 1995 we are required to hold an Immunisation Register that identifies the immunisation status of all our students. If there is a measles case in the school, any unimmunised children are to be excluded from the school for up to 14 days. We have e-mailed all families of students that we don't hold vaccination records for. If we don't hold a vaccination record for your child we will consider them not immunised so please send in a copy of their Immunisation certificate/records as soon as possible if you have been e-mailed by the school requesting this. If we have not made contact with you, then we hold an immunisation record for your child so no further action is needed.

SCHOOL FAIR RAFFLE
