DEAR PARENTS AND CAREGIVERS

NGĀ MIHI NUI KI A KOUTOU KATOA. GREETINGS TO YOU ALL.

The children and staff have returned to school this week refreshed and ready to tackle a very busy Term Three. Our Winter Outdoor Pursuits Programme commences next Friday 2 August for our Year 3 students with their first skating trip to the Alexandra Skating Rink, a second day is scheduled on the following Tuesday 6 August. Years 4-6 ski days at Cardrona are planned for Tuesday 13 & 20 August. Hārewa Team skating in Queenstown is scheduled for Weeks 3 & 4. Skiing and skating, combined with cross country events will keep everyone very active throughout the term. This term we are excited to be offering a tuakana/teina afternoon every alternate Friday to school assembly. This is a time when students will either be tuakana (leaders) or teina (learners). Some of our senior students will be joining teachers as tuakana to offer some exciting new activities for Years 2-6 students. Our Opportunities Programme this term includes Chess Club, Special Choir and a variety of music tuition groups and external competitions. We will also continue to provide the “Chill Zone” which offers an indoor lunch time space every day during the winter. This has been added because we no longer have the library available for students to use during the longer lunch break. Our Kapa Haka Group has already commenced weekly practices in preparation for their performance at the Murihiku Polyfest in Invercargill on Tuesday 28th

August. The Kapa Haka Group will also be performing at the Central Lakes Kapa Haka Festival in Queenstown early in Term 4. Community Crusaders are back again this year and Mrs Huffadine already has the organisation well underway for this. Students involved will be visiting either Ripponburn Rest Home or Care & Friendship every Wednesday lunchtime during this term to connect with elderly residents in Cromwell. Connecting with our wider community is an important part of our school value of contribution. This also links to the Citizenship Competency of our New Pedagogies for Deep Learning (NPDL) project. If you want to find out more about NPDL check out the display in the Block B corridor.

TERM 3 CURRICULUM OVERVIEW

Mathematics programmes will include multiplication/division and fractions, decimals and percentages; strand maths is Geometry & Measurement, the development of problem solving skills will continue. Inquiry work linked to the Science Material World focus using kitchen chemistry as the context for learning continues for all three teams. The Te Reo topic is Kai (food), PE will include fitness training for cross country, skiing/skating and later in the term athletics. Literacy programmes in reading and writing continue to build reading comprehension and decoding skills along with spelling and an exposure to a variety of writing styles and purposes.

TERM THREE PLANNER

We have included the Term Three Planner on the back of this week's newsletter. Please put it somewhere prominent to ensure you are kept well informed of school activities. The planner will be updated throughout the term so please ensure you refer to the most recent one. There is plenty planned for the term including skating, skiing, cross country and polyfest - lots of important dates to watch out for. Team assembly dates are also included on the planner starting in Week 3.

HEALTH & SAFETY NEWS

School's Responsibility for the Care of Children Before and After School

At the beginning of the new school term it is timely that we remind parents of the following expectations:

- School staff are responsible for students on the school grounds from when they arrive at school **after 8:30am**, and for **15 minutes after school**. **There should not be any students dropped off at school prior to 8:30am unless a special arrangement has been made with the class teacher involved.**
- Bus students will be supervised until they get onto their buses.
- Students in "After School Care" are supervised until 5:30pm or until they are collected.
- The only students allowed to play on our grounds after 3:15pm are children booked into After School Care or students accompanied by an adult.

Please note that a student's family are expected to take overall responsibility for a student before they arrive at school and after they leave. Older students who are trusted by their families to make their own choices and decisions will take on their own responsibility.

REPORTING STUDENT ABSENCES

We record daily student attendance electronically. Part of recording absences involves the teacher recording the reason for a student's absence. **For this reason, we ask that when you call or e-mail the school office about an absence, please state clearly whether your child is sick or is away for another reason e.g. special family occasion, medical appointment, family holiday etc.** The electronic system records absences as either justified or unjustified. The Ministry of Education expects us to follow up frequent unjustified absences, frequent lateness or patterns of attendance causing concern, with individual families involved.

HIGHLIGHTER VESTS

A reminder to all families using school buses that it is compulsory for children to wear a highlighter vest on the bus at all times. Vests can be purchased from Metrografix. Please ensure your child's vest is clearly named. A number of children have not been wearing vests this week. This is currently being monitored and may result in a child not being able to travel on the bus, as school health and safety procedures state that this is a requirement. We would appreciate your support with this matter.

CYBERSAFETY – DO YOU KNOW WHAT YOUR CHILDREN ARE DOING ON THEIR DEVICES?

Staff often discusses the concerns we have about the inappropriate use of social media and we all agree that it is possibly one of the biggest challenges facing the youth of today. We are aware of a number of children who have Instagram accounts. There is plenty of information available on the internet about age restrictions for all social media sites and the reasons for this. It is generally accepted that children under the age of 13 years should not be using Facebook, Instagram and other "adult" social media sites. Children can sometimes set up accounts with parental consent, meaning parents have control over the settings for these site. There are also child appropriate social media sites available for children. **We encourage all parents to research the internet to become fully informed about the different social media sites. We also advise you to monitor the use of devices by your children.**

COMPLAINTS TO THE SCHOOL POLICY

If you wish to contact the school about any concerns you may have please note our policy with regards to this:

- ✦ Complaints to be dealt with as soon as is practicably possible.
- ✦ For complaints dealing with pupils or staff members, the caregivers shall be encouraged to follow these steps:
 - ✦ contact the teacher.
 - ✦ contact the principal.
 - ✦ contact the Board in writing
- ✦ Where significant complaints occur the principal shall request the complaint be made in writing and recorded.
- ✦ Written complaints to the Board may be dealt with by the full Board or a subcommittee established to investigate them. The power of “in committee” procedure will be used to deal with the confidentiality of the complaint.
- ✦ The terms and conditions of a staff member shall be referred to in the event of complaint being lodged against them. (Refer collectives or IEC’s).


