



Classes have been busy getting to know each other, along with completing numerous tests and assessments to ensure that we group children accurately and to enable us to best meet their individual needs. Kapa Haka sessions have already commenced for our Performance Group, with Amber Nepe and Claire Lincoln leading this in 2019. Our Te Reo Specialist Teacher, Mary-Anne Tamati, has been working in junior classes each week for thirty minutes and then delivering Te Reo Language sessions for teachers in order to develop their confidence and to extend their skills. We know this will result in positive outcomes for the children in classrooms. We have high numbers of student interested in learning the guitar or an instrument through SMMC and Ms Pugh has already started working with a group of over thirty students in our choir. It is great to see so many students getting actively involved in opportunities being made available to them at school.

EOTC REPORT

Year 6 students had a fantastic time on their Mt Cook Camp. This was an awesome opportunity for the group to learn about the Mt Cook National Park, to see our highest mountain and to learn about the flora and fauna found in the park. Our Year 5 students are off to Camp Columba (Pukerau near Gore) in Week 8 (18-22 March). Hārewa Team is planning a range of EOTC activities, class teachers will communicate directly with parents about these. Kārearea Team has already completed part of their EOTC Week that included First Aid, cycle safety and a bike ride and a walk down the lake track from Bannockburn. Other activities planned include an overnight camp at the Te Rau Aroha Marae (Bluff) for Year 4 students (this was postponed from this week to Term 4 due to building work happening on the marae) and kayaking. We really appreciate the parental support we have received which has helped make these outdoor activities and experiences possible.

PAID UNION MEETINGS – WEDNESDAY 20TH MARCH

All teachers who belong to the NZEI will be attending Paid Union Meetings on Wednesday 20th March. These meetings will be held in Cromwell at two different times during the day, to enable all teachers to attend either in the morning or the afternoon while the school remains open. This means no inconvenience for parents this time round.

TEACHER ONLY DAY – SCHOOL CLOSED TUESDAY 26TH MARCH

School will be closed for instruction **Tuesday 26th March** (the day after Otago Anniversary Day), to enable all classroom teachers & support staff to attend further training with our ICT Professional Development Facilitators (UTB – Using Technology Better). This Teacher Only Day involves our Cromwell Community of Learning (CoL) and will include staff from Goldfields Primary and Cromwell College. This is another opportunity for our staff to connect and hear key messages about the new Digital Technologies Curriculum. We feel very fortunate that we have the Otago Community Trust Grant (\$300,000) and 500 Professional Development Hours to support staff with “leveraging digital”, to provide engaging ways to work and share learning.

CURRICULUM CORNER: STARTING SCHOOL

Everyone in the family has to make adjustments to routines once school starts. Establishing workable routines helps everyone cope with their own responsibilities while easing things for others in the family. At the start of the school year, put in place a family plan for bedtimes, morning routines and after-school chores, commitments and homework. A plan will help the family function smoothly, ensure important priorities are met and keep everyone happy and healthy for a successful year.

Strategies:

1. Consider how many activities children can realistically manage. Homework, music lessons, clubs, scouts, sports, dance and speech lessons are all important in building a rounded personality, but children of all ages can become stressed if they take on too much. School demands can vary from year to year and should be taken into account when decisions are made about which activities children will sign up for.
2. Ensure school-age children get enough sleep. Both the brain and the body need sleep to refresh, recharge, and function effectively. Establish bedtime routines and stick to them throughout the year. When children know you are serious they will organise themselves around the times you have set. Well-rested children are healthier. Parents also need some quiet time to themselves in the evening.
3. Maintain a master calendar. The school provides a Term Calendar (attached to the newsletter) which shows all main events happening at school each term. You may choose to buy a large calendar and keep track of everyone's programmes and events. Checking, maintaining and up-dating the calendar can become a routine and help everyone see and respect the busy lives every family member leads, including Mum and Dad.

WEB STEPS - AVAILABLE TO YOUR CHILD.

Steps is an internationally recognised programme which is used in over 700 schools throughout New Zealand. Steps is a research based literacy programme. It is non age specific, which means anyone regardless of age and ability can be catered for.

Aims of the programme are to strengthen:

- letter/sound correspondence
- Processing skills with sounds and sound patterns
- Rapid whole word recognition
- Spelling accuracy

You can purchase Web Steps yourself online for your child at \$80. However, Learning Staircase who manage the Steps programme provide a less expensive option through your child's school. We can register your child for Web Steps at a cost of \$15.00 per student. Websteps allows students to access the programme on any device.

OPPORTUNITIES PROGRAMME 2019

Special Choir: The Special Choir. Choir is up and running already with Miss Pugh. The choir is invited to sing in the local community on a number of occasions throughout the year. If your child is in Years 3-6 and missed the original notices about choir, they can catch up with Ms Pugh at school about this.

Guitar: sessions with Pete Stevenson started last Thursday. At this stage we have nearly 50 students interested so Pete will be very busy. Pete organises the children into groups of 4 or 5, with new students being kept together and returning students being grouped according to their playing ability. Individual letters have been given to interested students about this, as there is a charge per term (a lump sum can be paid for the whole year). We have restricted guitar to Years 4-6 children because of the large number of interested children. Children who were involved with guitar last year will also take precedence, when we have large numbers wanting to learn.

Saturday Morning Music Lessons (SMMC): Johanna Hansen is responsible for this tuition with lessons being held on Tuesdays this year. We have 12 students currently enrolled for violin lessons. If your child is interested in learning violin, cello or clarinet, please contact Wendy or Kate (445-0264). Enrolment forms are available from the office.

Kapa Haka: Amber Nepe and Miss Claire are the staff members in charge of Kapa Haka tuition every Monday afternoon this year. There is an expectation that all our senior Māori students will participate in this activity. This year's performances will include the Uruuruwhenua Festival (Alexandra), Murihiku Polyfest (Invercargill) and the Wakatipu Polyfest (Queenstown).

Our newsletter will be emailed once a fortnight (hard copies will be provided for families without internet access). A huge amount of time is spent preparing the fortnightly newsletter as it is our main form of communication with home. Please let us know if you do not receive a copy each fortnight. Notices will be emailed on the alternate week, as there is always information for families from school. Newsletter weeks in Term One will be Weeks 1, 2, 4, 6, 8 & 10.

HEALTH & SAFETY NEWS

- **Highlighter Vests:** a reminder that it is compulsory for all children travelling on school buses to wear a highlighter vest. Please support the school by ensuring your child has a vest in their school bag for daily use.
- **Hats:** we are still reminding a number of children about the compulsory wearing of hats in Terms 1/4. It has been good to see lots of hats being purchased from the office. We remind parents that caps are not suitable for wearing at school – we expect children to wear our school hat with a brim. Please ensure these are clearly named!!
- **Footwear:** there are lots of bees on our grass areas, so please remind your children that they must wear shoes at school, especially in the playground to avoid this.
- **Drink Bottles:** please ensure that your child has a named drink bottle for their water. We encourage the regular drinking of water at school.

Good family rules to promote safety include:


- Never accept a ride from a stranger, make sure a parent knows where you are at all times, don't reveal personal information to strangers (including online) and keep the door locked and don't answer it if you are home alone.
- "No, Go, Yell, Tell". These four words are part of the National Crime Prevention Council for teaching children about strangers. This phrase teaches children to yell "No!" if approached by strangers, run away quickly, yell for help and tell a trusted adult what happened. Even young children can learn these four words and what to do.
- Most children will grow up without having any trouble with strangers, but it's best to be prepared. Teach your children to be aware of the people around them and follow basic safety rules. Doing this will help them have confidence to know how to keep themselves safe. Start today!

BOARD ELECTIONS - HAVE YOU EVER THOUGHT ABOUT BECOMING A SCHOOL TRUSTEE?

The Board are preparing for the upcoming Triennial BoT elections. Elections are held every three years and I urge the Cromwell Primary School community to consider the important role of the Board of Trustees. to help shape and support the education of their children.

I have found my time on the BOT very rewarding and a great chance to use my strategic management skills to help our kids. I wanted to be part of making a positive difference and setting clear direction for the learning and achievement of children at Cromwell Primary School. Being an active leader in our school and part of a highly professional and effective team has been a great experience.

What does the BOT do?

The BOT is responsible for the governance of the school. The board is the employer of all staff and is responsible for setting the school's strategic direction and targets in consultation with parents, staff and students. We monitor and evaluate how well we do against these targets. The Board is also responsible for overseeing the management of personnel, curriculum, property, finance and administration. We ensure that our school provides a safe environment and quality education for all of our students. We want every child to achieve their potential at CPS.

Who are we looking for?

We need a range of skills, experiences and backgrounds on our BOT to ensure our decisions are balanced, considered and have the best possible outcomes for our children. Being a good communicator with an enquiring mind and having the ability to ask challenging questions certainly helps. There are specific skills that are helpful to our Board including financial skills, experience with property, communications or employment.

Parents, caregivers and people from the wider community can be elected to our school board. Normally our school has five parent elected representatives and one staff elected representative. The principal is also a member of the board.

Training and support

The Korari Programme is available for anyone interested in finding out about standing for the school board elections and having a say in the education of their children. Resources available are:

- **Korari:** a programme (workshop) that provides you with governance training to help you understand the role of school boards of trustees. Workshops for Korari will be held in March/April this year. Please see poster in Community Notices section.
- **Korari form:** NZSTA will support anyone who advises us they are interested in becoming a trustee, by way of the workshops but also providing access to their Learning Management System where online modules re. school governance, student achievement etc. can be completed. (school office)
- **Community member guide to the role of the board of trustees:** This explains a lot of commonly asked questions and information about becoming a trustee.

FINANCES

- School Costs will be billed to your child's account. A statement will be sent out monthly that shows the items billed and payments made.
- Please pay by internet banking (03-1735-0004162-000). Please put name and what it relates to as the reference and/or e-mail Tegan to advise. If you are unable to pay by internet banking, payment can be made by cash or cheque. Please place cash/cheque in a named envelope and specify what the payment is for on the envelope. The envelope can be given to the classroom teacher to come to the office in the purple bag. If dropping the envelope to the office, please put envelope in the post-it slot. **We do not have eftpos.**
- **We have limited cash, so please endeavour to pay the exact amount of cash.**
- **You can pay regular amounts to cover costs e.g \$5 per week if NE-Y2, \$10 per week if Y3&4, \$15 Y5&6.**
- Should you require assistance to meet school costs, please contact the principal or Tegan in the office as there is assistance that is available.

AFTER-SCHOOL CARE PROGRAMME



Tomorrow's Schools Review: Consultation update



The report by the Tomorrow's Schools Independent Taskforce *Our Schooling Futures: Stronger Together* | Whiria Ngā Kura Tōātinini was released in December 2018. The Independent Taskforce is now very keen to receive feedback from as many people as possible to help complete their final recommendations.

Public consultation on the report is now open and we really encourage school staff, board members, PTA members, parents, whanau and the wider school community to have their say on the future of our schooling system....

- The Taskforce will be holding public consultation meetings around the country, starting on Thursday, 14 February and finishing on the 27th March. We really encourage everyone to come along to these events and find out more about the report and its proposals. The full schedule is now available on the website (venues will be added for events as they are confirmed) <https://conversation.education.govt.nz/tsr>
- An online survey which canvasses opinion on each of our 32 recommendations is now available and will remain open until 31 March 2019 <https://consultation.education.govt.nz/tsr>
- Postcards: for students, families and anyone that just wants to briefly 'have their say' on a recommendation or the full report. Postcards will be available at the public meetings.
- An 0800 for Oral submissions will be available from 11 Feb. Call 0800 FOR TSR to leave your thoughts on the future of our schooling system.
