

This is our final newsletter for 2019. We can reflect on another very busy and successful year at Cromwell Primary School. We are still collating and analysing our end of year data, but we are hoping that we continue to have high percentages of students achieving at or above expected curriculum levels. We proudly celebrated our Chess Team qualifying for Nationals in Christchurch, our Year 6 Top Bike Team winning the Year 5/6 Section of the Regional Top Bike Competition, 1st School Team in the Cromwell Half Marathon, Year 5 Boys' 1st Dunstan Zone Cross Country, 1st Year 6 Girls' Team Dunstan Zone Cross Country and a number of students who were awarded Distinctions, Credits and Merits in ICAS Assessments.



Other 2019 highlights include:

- The appointment of our first two Across Kāhui Ako Lead Teachers of the Cromwell Community of Learning (Te Kāhui Ako o Ngā Awanui) which has seen a significant lift in the collaboration between the three schools and six Early Childhood Centres.
- Ending the year with our highest ever roll – 357 students.
- Welcome “mihi whakatau” every term.
- \$200,000 Lotteries Community Facility Grant extended for further 12 months to enable our Multipurpose Project to move forward.
- Kapa Haka performances at Murihiku Festival in Invercargill, Uruuruwhenua Central Otago Polyfest and Central Lakes Polyfest in Queenstown are great examples of how we are continuing to strengthen the cultural dimensions of our school.
- The opening of our new Ako, four classroom senior learning hub at the beginning of Term 2.
- The fantastic School Fair which raised an amazing \$54,000 for a playground Spider Frame Climbing Rig.
- Learning celebrations have included Mad About Science Kitchen Chemistry, Fantastical Feast, Movie Night, Building Masters Exhibition & United Nations Sustainable Development Goals Exhibition.
- EOTC Week experiences including Camp Columba, Mt Cook and the Te Aroha Marae Trip (Bluff) and a range of local based activities.
- Visiting performers – Dunedin Symphony Orchestra, Neds Mindset Mission & Tanya Batt Storyteller.
- Our Levels of Responsibility have ensured that all students are very clear about our expectations of behaviour and the importance of being self-managing and personally responsible for their actions and decisions.
- Finally we have received so much positive feedback about the great behaviour our students display when they are attending events outside of school. From the staff at Cardrona, the Local Hangout Youth Workers and the Highland Park Team, to the A.J.Hackett staff who commended the Year 6 students on their excellent manners during their trip to the bungy. I believe that as a school community we should feel very proud of the wonderful young citizens of the future we are helping to shape.

2019 - THE YEAR OF CONTINUING GROWTH

This year has been another year of significant changes, mostly linked to our continued growth. Our roll has grown to 357 and this has meant we have had to review many of our school systems and processes to ensure that what we are doing is effective and appropriate for a school of our size. Our new roll growth classroom building project was completed and our senior children moved into this at the beginning of Term 2. Our multipurpose building has continued to be a work in progress, but we have finally been able to secure a company to progress this project, with construction planned to commence in 2020. This project is an example of the importance of having a long term vision and strategic planning goal which has enabled us to raise the significant funds required to achieve this goal. We appreciate the patience of our community who have been raising funds for this project for several years. Between school fundraising from three previous school fairs and a significant amount of community trusts funding, we are now financially able to commit to this project for the benefit of the children now and in the future. We have also employed additional staff members in response to our growing roll. We have had to relinquish the use of the Junction Suite as our school library again this year, as currently we have 55 Years 3/4 students based in there. Lots of changes to adapt to, but the one thing that has not changed is that we continue to be a high performing school. We encourage the children to be the best learners and people they can be, and the staff work tirelessly to ensure that all students receive the best possible learning opportunities in order to ensure individual success.

2019 STUDENT COUNCIL END OF YEAR MESSAGE

Thanks everyone for supporting us this year. We raised \$800.00 for Starship Hospital and \$1,000.00 for a new outdoor chess set. The School Talent Quest was very popular with lots of talent on show in Term 3.
