

This week is Bully Free Week with the key message that “together we can stop bullying at school”.



Some key messages about bullying that we are sharing with the children this week are:

***Bullying is when someone*** - keeps picking on you again and again, makes fun of you a lot, tells other kids not to be your friend, tried to make you feel bad about who you are, tells nasty stories about you, keeps hitting or pushing you around.

***Bullying can happen*** - to anybody, anytime, anywhere, any way

***Being bullied can make children feel*** - sad, lonely, scared sick, hurt, angry, embarrassed and not want to go to school.

***If you see bullying at school***- don't stand by and let it happen, walk away, don't laugh and join in, be kind to the student being bullied, show you care, take them away from the bullying, tell them no one deserves to be bullied, ask the student being bullied to join in with you and your friends.

## EVERY DAY MATTERS – STUDENT ATTENDANCE – MINISTRY OF EDUCATION INITIATIVE

Student attendance is tracked by the Ministry of Education through our electronic attendance system. We use “Edge” our Student Management System to record daily student attendance, both in the morning and afternoon. Each term we receive a report from the Ministry of Education about our student attendance rates, including lateness to school.

Key attendance patterns and information from our Term 1 report:

- 90% is the figure MOE use to define “attending regularly”.
- Teachers use codes to define why a student is absent – M (Medical), Q (School event offsite such as camp), D (Dr), J (Justified absence which has been discussed with the school such as a funeral, special family occasion), E (Explained absence but unjustified – day off for birthday, long weekend), G (overseas holiday)
- Over a school year student attendance is highest in Term 1 – 2019 (95.3%).
- The most absences occur in Term 3 each year.
- Term 1 attendance was highest in Year 5 at 91.7%.
- The highest number of absences occurred in Year 1 at 13.6%.
- There were slightly more male absences (12%) compared to females (9.8%).
- Students attending school 0-70% had the highest proportion of unjustified absences with 83.6% being due to unjustified absences.
- The highest proportion of justified absence was illness at 51%.
- The most common unjustified absence is family holiday during the school term.
- Y6 students had the highest percentage of arriving on time at 92.1%.
- Year 1 had the lowest percentage of arriving on time at 76.3%

## HEALTH & SAFETY NEWS: WINTER WEATHER REMINDERS

We remind families of the following procedures if the winter weather is of concern:

- School closure decisions are made in conjunction with Cromwell College and Goldfields School. Norm Wing (Cromwell Bus Controller) makes the decision for early or late departures of buses and he contacts the radio station.
- Details of school late starts or closures will be broadcast on More FM 94.3fm or 531am, as early as possible.
- Details will also available on our school facebook page and on our school answer phone (445 0264).
- The school blackboard will provide up to date information about any closures or late starts.
- Bus families have already received a newsletter outlining all relevant details and also our school bus tree which we will put into operation if we have to organise for buses to leave school earlier than usual due to weather. If you have any concerns about road or weather conditions, or encounter a problem with the school bus in the morning please call Wendy(CPS School Bus Controller) directly on 0273931032 or 445 1146.
- Don't panic! If school is closed during the school day, children who are waiting to be collected will be kept safe and warm.
- It is important that school has up to date and accurate information regarding your contact details, including address, telephone and mobile.

## MOVING TO, FROM AND ABOUT THE SCHOOL SAFELY

- To avoid injuries on our grounds, please use steps and safety rails provided.
- Please remind your child that if they bike or scooter to school, once they are on school grounds they are expected to park up their bikes/scooters to avoid running into people on foot and causing injuries.
- Bikes and scooters must be parked in the stands provided. They must NOT be dumped on the grounds, paths or outside doorways as they are trip hazards.
- If your child is riding to school we recommend the wearing of highlighter vests to ensure they are visible to other road and footpath users.
- We recommend that children riding scooters to school wear safety helmets.
- Take care over the winter and watch out for icy areas. Signage will be used at school if the paths are slippery.

## IT'S TIME YOUR CHILDREN HAD THE EDUCATION THEY DESERVE

Schools are facing a teacher shortage crisis, with a 40% drop in people training to be teachers; and a growing number of school-aged children. In late 2018, 50% of schools reported that they did not have enough teachers. Schools are struggling to attract teaching staff, and that problem looks set to worsen. There is also a desperate need for more support for children with additional learning needs. Yet, the Government recorded a bumper surplus of \$2.5 billion in April 2019. The money is available and we're calling on the government to prioritise a quality public education for every child.

### WHAT WE ARE CAMPAIGNING FOR?

- \* More teachers – so your kids can get more attention
- \* More resources/staff to support children with additional learning needs
- \* A pay jolt to salaries for teachers to address the teacher shortage – so that your children will have a teacher in the future.

We greatly appreciate the community support that we have already received following the decision by teachers and principals to strike on Wednesday 29 May. The decision to take further strike action was not taken lightly by any of us. For the first time, both primary and secondary teachers are striking together because the crisis in education hits us all very hard and we need the Government to understand how serious it is.

Schools are grappling with the fallout of a 40% nosedive in the number of people training to be teachers between 2010 and 2016, even while the population grew by 400,000. While the situation improved a little last year and the Government has announced an urgent \$95m package to recruit teachers, this is not sufficient to address the crisis. Schools struggle daily to find enough teachers to meet their relief teacher needs and this will worsen as winter approaches. There is also a desperate need for more support for children with additional learning needs. The fact is that teaching is no longer considered an attractive profession due to long-term under-funding of the education sector. A significant pay jolt is part of the solution, alongside significant improvements to our heavy workloads. Otherwise our schools will end up with larger class sizes and more teachers leaving.

## INTERNATIONAL COMPETITIONS AND ASSESSMENTS FOR SCHOOLS (ICAS) YEARS 3-6

At Cromwell Primary School we facilitate the ICAS competitions every year. The assessments are external assessments and are not marked by teachers at Cromwell Primary School. They are designed to challenge students who would like to enter a competition in a particular subject. Over one million children throughout Australia and New Zealand enter these every year. This year most of the exams have changed from pen and paper to online exams and are being held later in the year than in previous years. Entry is entirely optional and is a decision for the student and family to make. ### WEB STEPS - AVAILABLE TO YOUR CHILD.

Steps is an internationally recognised programme which is used in over 700 schools throughout New Zealand. Steps is a research based literacy programme. It is non age specific, which means anyone regardless of age and ability can be catered for.

Aims of the programme are to strengthen:

- letter/sound correspondence
- Processing skills with sounds and sound patterns
- Rapid whole word recognition
- Spelling accuracy

You can purchase Web Steps yourself online for your child at \$80. However, Learning Staircase who manage the Steps programme provide a less expensive option through your child's school. We can register your child for Web Steps at a cost of \$15.00 per student. Websteps allows students to access the programme on any device.

## BOARD ELECTIONS - HAVE YOU EVER THOUGHT ABOUT BECOMING A SCHOOL TRUSTEE?

The Board are preparing for the upcoming Triennial BoT elections to be held on the **7 June 2019**. Elections are held every three years and I urge the Cromwell Primary School community to consider the important role of the Board of Trustees. to help shape and support the education of their children.

I have found my time on the BOT very rewarding and a great chance to use my strategic management skills to help our kids. I wanted to be part of making a positive difference and setting clear direction for the learning and achievement of children at Cromwell Primary School. Being an active leader in our school and part of a highly professional and effective team has been a great experience.

### What does the BOT do?

The BOT is responsible for the governance of the school. The board is the employer of all staff and is responsible for setting the school's strategic direction and targets in consultation with parents, staff and students. We monitor and evaluate how well we do against these targets. The Board is also responsible for overseeing the management of personnel, curriculum, property, finance and administration. We ensure that our school provides a safe environment and quality education for all of our students. We want every child to achieve their potential at CPS.

### Who are we looking for?

We need a range of skills, experiences and backgrounds on our BOT to ensure our decisions are balanced, considered and have the best possible outcomes for our children. Being a good communicator with an enquiring mind and having the ability to ask challenging questions certainly helps. There are specific skills that are helpful to our Board including financial skills, experience with property, communications or employment.

Parents, caregivers and people from the wider community can be elected to our school board. Normally our school has five parent elected representatives and one staff elected representative. The principal is also a member of the board.

The Korari Programme is available for anyone interested in finding out about standing for the school board elections and having a say in the education of their children. Resources available are:

The voting roll is open for inspection at the school and can be viewed during normal school hours.




