
A big thank you to Pub Charity who funded the purchase of whiteware for the kitchen in the new Senior Hub.



Anzac Wreaths

The focus for the first few days of the new term has been Anzac Day, with all classes hearing stories about the brave Anzacs, many of whom sacrificed their lives to protect NZ, our precious homeland. We held our school Anzac Service today and we appreciated the attendance of several Cromwell RSA members. It was lovely to hear the choir sing and to hear the special tributes that were shared by our speakers. Thanks also to Warren Cox who played the “Last Post” and to Kārearea 1 for arranging this special service.

Watching the live Anzac Service on television from the Gallipoli Peninsula during the holidays always brings back many special memories for me having attended the service held at Anzac Cove in Turkey in 2011. This year I attended the Cromwell Anzac Service and I know that many of our students attended services in Cromwell, Lowburn and Bannockburn. This national day of remembrance is so important and is what defines us both as a country and as New Zealanders.



Special thanks to Tiaane N and Connor H for representing our school so well at the wreath laying ceremony in Cromwell on Anzac Day. They looked great in their uniforms and we felt very proud of them as they joined the parade outside and placed our wreath at the cenotaph.

The students have settled quickly back into school routines and we have an action packed term planned for them. Opportunities such as choir, guitar, violin and chess are back up and running. Many of our senior students will also be involved with enrichment opportunities that Jayne Fitzgerald will be coordinating this term. These include preparing for the Central Otago Spelling and Social Studies Quizzes and the University of Otago Problem Solving Challenge. Senior students in our Top Bike Teams will be heading to Alexandra in Week 3 to participate in this annual competition and yesterday our swimmers who qualified for the Dunstan Zone Swimming Sports competed in this event at the Cromwell Swim Centre. It is pleasing to note the large number of students seeking extra challenges and opportunities to enrich and extend their learning – evidence of a “growth mindset” towards learning.



Swimming commences tomorrow for Years 3-6 classes. Sessions for the children will involve development of correct stroke techniques by practising gliding, kicking, floating and balancing their bodies in the water. Senior classes will also learn about river and lake safety. Our inquiry topic this term is a Science Material World focus using a “kitchen chemistry” context to help build conceptual understanding about “change”. The inquiry hook used on Monday by Hārewa Team teachers to provoke some curiosity certainly did the trick worked with some amazing conversations happening as a result. The Kapa Haka Performance Group will be busy working with Amber Nepe and Ms Claire, in preparation for the Murihiku Polyfest in Invercargill in Term 3.

GILBERTHORPE SCHOOL MORNING TEA

At the end of last term, Cromwell Primary School shouted Gilberthorpe School Staff morning tea. This was an OPPA (Otago Primary Principal’s Association) initiative to show support for the schools in Christchurch in response to the Mosque Shootings. CURRICULUM CORNER: "THE POWER OF PARENTAL INVOLVEMENT"

PROPERTY UPDATE

We have a number of projects being developed currently.

1. School Heating – we have decommissioned our old heating system which is to be replaced by heat pumps in all rooms. After a feasibility exercise undertaken by MOE consultants, the decision to install heat pumps has been made, as this solution provides both heating and cooling options all year round. This project is expected to be completed by Queen's Birthday Weekend.
2. Innovative Learning Environment Project (ex Ako classrooms). Plans are being finalised for this modernisation project that will provide a two classroom learning hub for the Kārearea Team hopefully for the start of the 2020 school year.
3. Multipurpose Building Project. This project is currently being reviewed by the board who is hoping to have a clear direction for this project in the near future. MOE consent has finally been granted for the construction of a new building on school land. The space between the new senior hub and the staff carpark for this building is the site identified for this project.
4. New 5 Year Agreement (5YA) for Capital Works Development in the school over the period 2019 – 2024 is currently being developed. Proposed projects include the Ako redevelopment, new irrigation pumps, new toilets in the Junior Block and carpet replacement in Kārearea 1 & 2.

- School Costs will be billed to your child's account. A statement will be sent out monthly that shows the items billed and payments made.

The envelope can be given to the classroom teacher to come to the office in the purple bag. If dropping the envelope to the office, please put envelope in the post-it slot. **We do not have eftpos.**

BOARD ELECTIONS - HAVE YOU EVER THOUGHT ABOUT BECOMING A SCHOOL TRUSTEE?

The Board are preparing for the upcoming Triennial BoT elections to be held on the **7 June 2019**. Elections are held every three years and I urge the Cromwell Primary School community to consider the important role of the Board of Trustees. to help shape and support the education of their children.

I have found my time on the BOT very rewarding and a great chance to use my strategic management skills to help our kids. I wanted to be part of making a positive difference and setting clear direction for the learning and achievement of children at Cromwell Primary School. Being an active leader in our school and part of a highly professional and effective team has been a great experience.

What does the BOT do?

The BOT is responsible for the governance of the school. The board is the employer of all staff and is responsible for setting the school's strategic direction and targets in consultation with parents, staff and students. We monitor and evaluate how well we do against these targets. The Board is also responsible for overseeing the management of personnel, curriculum, property, finance and administration. We ensure that our school provides a safe environment and quality education for all of our students. We want every child to achieve their potential at CPS.

Who are we looking for?

We need a range of skills, experiences and backgrounds on our BOT to ensure our decisions are balanced, considered and have the best possible outcomes for our children. Being a good communicator with an enquiring mind and having the ability to ask challenging questions certainly helps. There are specific skills that are helpful to our Board including financial skills, experience with property, communications or employment.

Parents, caregivers and people from the wider community can be elected to our school board. Normally our school has five parent elected representatives and one staff elected representative. The principal is also a member of the board.

Training and support

The Korari Programme is available for anyone interested in finding out about standing for the school board elections and having a say in the education of their children. Resources available are:

- **Korari:** a programme (workshop) that provides you with governance training to help you understand the role of school boards of trustees. Workshops for Korari will be held in March/April this year. Please see poster in Community Notices section.
- **Korari form:** NZSTA will support anyone who advises us they are interested in becoming a trustee, by way of the workshops but also providing access to their Learning Management System where online modules re. school governance, student achievement etc. can be completed. (school office)
- **Community member guide to the role of the board of trustees:** This explains a lot of commonly asked questions and information about becoming a trustee.

AFTER-SCHOOL CARE PROGRAMME

The Afterschool Care Programme is a service that is provided by Cromwell Primary School in a response to a lack of Afterschool Services in our community. It is separate to the core services provided by the school and is funded solely by the fees paid by the caregivers using the service. We receive no funding from the Ministry of Education or any other sources.

To ensure this service remains viable, casual users of the service are required to pay on the day of the booking (or by the end of the week if there are a number of bookings in the week). No invoice will be issued, unless payment is overdue. For users who have permanent bookings, invoices will be issued monthly and are required to be paid within 7 days.

These fees are used to pay the wages of the supervisors, so any delay in payment compromises the ability of the programme to continue.

If payment is overdue, we will follow this up with a phone call. To avoid any embarrassment, please pay by the due date.

We also ask that you pick your children up by 5:30 at the very latest as our supervisors have other commitments and it can cause significant inconvenience if they have to wait for caregivers who are late picking up their children. We will be charging a late pick up fee for anyone who is consistently late picking up their child/children and it may result in their booking being cancelled.

Please note the following:

- Ensure you see Sue or Tracey to sign your child out when picking them up.
- Make sure you let the office know if your child is not attending Afterschool Care as there is a waiting list.
- Remind your child that they need to be checked in by Sue or Tracey before going out to play
- Provide enough food for your child for afternoon tea.
- Afterschool Care is a device free zone (other than Chromebooks)
