## SCHOOL LUNCHES

**There will be no heat ups in Terms 1 & 4 this year.** Heat ups will continue on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays in Terms 2 & 3 only. Please wrap heat-ups in foil and name them clearly. Heat ups are to be placed on the tray outside the Caretaker’s Office, opposite Room 3 (Hārewa 6) in the Junior Block, before school. Heat-ups will be delivered to classrooms at 12:30pm. **NO noodles** requiring hot water please. Healthy Eating and Nutrition are a huge national focus and as a school we have worked hard to ensure our lunch provision procedures are in line with suggested guidelines. **Subway and sushi will continue to be available all year round - Tuesday (subway) and Thursday (sushi).** Please place orders/money in envelopes which are to be put in the class purple bag before school). Lunches will be delivered to classrooms.

## SCHOOL LIBRARY CLOSED 2019

Our library will remain closed again this year. After unsuccessfully trying to keep it running alongside the two classes operating out of this space, we have reluctantly made this decision due to book losses and the difficulties associated with trying to arrange open times outside general class teaching times. Hopefully we will have the new Senior Learning Hub operating by Term 2 and at this stage we intend to commence an upgrade of the Ako classrooms. This means that K3 & K4 will remain in the library most likely for the remainder of 2019. In the interim there are bins of library books in classrooms and classes can also arrange visits to the Cromwell Public Library.

## HEALTH AND SAFETY

### SUNHATS

We remind both children and parents that our school policy “**No Hat, No Play**” requires all students to wear a protective sunhat with a brim, when they are playing out in the playground in Terms 1 and 4. Hats are available from the office for \$16:00, please note these do not have the house colours on them. The hats with house colour logos are available from Metrografix. All children must be wearing either the navy uniform hat or a plain navy hat with a brim. No other hats will be allowed (including caps). Please support the school by ensuring that your child has the correct hat.

### FOOTWEAR

We require the children to wear shoes in the playground to avoid beestings and cuts. We work hard to keep the playground free of any sharp objects, but with easy public access to our grounds, there is no guarantee that we find every sharp object that may find its way onto our grassed areas. We would appreciate your support with this by ensuring that your child wears suitable shoes to school.

## PARENTAL PERMISSION EDUCATION OUTSIDE THE CLASSROOM LOCAL VENUES 2019

It is important that every family completes and returns this form, if you have not already done so. Please note this will be the last time you will be required to complete this form, as we have changed the EOTC Permission Form to cover the entire time your child is at our school. When new children enrol at school they will be asked to complete this form at this time. All forms will be filed in the office. Families who have not returned this form risk having children miss out on activities, due to no parental consent being given. Risk management requirements include parental permission for any activities outside school. Spare forms are available from the office.

## HIGHLIGHTER VESTS

We remind all parents of bus students that our school policy states that children travelling on school buses must be wearing a highlighter vest. Please ensure your child has a vest to wear on a daily basis.

## DRINK BOTTLES

We encourage children to have drink bottles in the classroom, but please ensure that they are filled with water only and that they are named. We wish to promote healthy drinking during the course of the day, to assist learning. We have a “brain food” break around 10:00am every day.

## SCHOOL ROAD SAFETY

The beginning of any new school year is a good time to remind people about the need to drive slowly and carefully around our school “drop off and pick up” areas. We have school patrols operating every morning and afternoon on Molyneux Avenue and Monaghan Streets, but we urge you to take care when driving in these areas. The local police have been assisting us to ensure a safe start to 2019. The legal speed limit when passing a school bus is 20 kilometres per hour when approaching from either direction. Please do not park or stop on the yellow lines near our road patrols as it makes it very difficult for the patrols to operate safely due to a lack of clear vision of approaching traffic.

## SCHOOL CAR PARK

**Children have been reminded that the carpark area is out of bounds unless accompanied by a parent.** Thank you to everyone who has continued to support our efforts to make this a safe area by NOT using it for parking when dropping off and collecting children during those busy times before and after school. We remind parents that the school car park is out of bounds between 8:30-9:15am and 2:30-3:15pm. By keeping cars out of the carpark, we ensure that this area is kept safe for parents who walk across this area to drop off and pick up children. The carpark is however, able to be used during the day when collecting sick children or dropping off something to the office, but we wish to reinforce that this area is not to be used for parking during those busy times before and after school times. We will continue to monitor the use of this area, to ensure that all parents are made aware of our expectations. We want the carpark to continue to be a safe area. We have created drop off zones between the entrance/exit to our school carpark and on the school side of Monaghan Street between the crossing and Ray Street to support those busy pick up and drop off times. Please do not get out of your cars when using these drop off zones. Children should exit cars on the footpath side of the vehicle.

## CURRICULUM CORNER

Before launching into some heavy educational material, this week we have some suggestions for parents wishing to get more involved with school.

- Visit the school with your child.
- Attend Goal Setting Meetings and Student Led Conferences with your child.
- Join the SOKs Group (Support our Kids).
- Check your emails and read the school newsletter.
- Get to know the teacher and the principal.
- Come along to a monthly Board of Trustees Meeting (BoT Elections this year).
- Read all school communications.
- Volunteer your time and talents.
- Attend school events such as sports days, assemblies etc.
- Help out at fund raising activities.
- Be a parent help in class.
- Talk to your child about their day at school.
- Have some fun!!

### **Homework** (School Self Review Focus in 2018)

Research indicates that at primary school level, homework has little effect on student achievement. However, we believe that the following goals can be fulfilled by assigning some tasks to be undertaken at home:

- To promote the development of positive, successful work and study habits and self-management skills and attitudes.
- To build an attitude that learning is a lifelong skill and takes place outside school as well as in school.

- To foster an active partnership between home and school and to keep parents informed about their children's learning.

Thanks to the 80 parents who provided feedback about homework through our Google Survey for parents in Term 4 last year. We have not yet finalised our new policy, so in the interim, class teachers will advise parents about their expectations of homework for individual classes. We will publish our new draft policy statement (based on all the feedback we have received from parents, students and teachers) and considering research on this topic, as soon as this has been completed.

## COMPUTER & INTERNET USE AGREEMENTS

We remind all families that when their child/children started school an agreement was signed by both the student and parent. This agreement includes rules that the students must follow, taking care of school computers, being considerate of other users and looking after themselves sensibly. The school also recommends checking out further information about cybersafety on our school website [www.cromprimary.school.nz](http://www.cromprimary.school.nz) or at [www.netsafe.org.nz](http://www.netsafe.org.nz). A copy of all cybersafety information is also available from the school office.

The educational environment is rapidly moving towards greater use of the online learning environment. Schools take responsibility for teaching children about digital citizenship very seriously and programmes about this, including cybersafety, are an integral part of our school programmes. If you have any concerns about this please talk to classroom teachers in the first instance. All Years 3-6 students have been set up with personal gmail accounts, to enable them to keep a digital record of their learning and reflections about this. All Years 5/6 students will have their own, or be issued with a school Chromebook, for the year. We have really appreciated that a significant number of parents have purchased Chromebooks for their child/children to use at school. Cromwell College continues with their BYOD (Bring Your Own Device) Programme at Year 7 this year, so we know that our students will be well-prepared for this with our 1:1 device programme in Years 5/6.

## WEB STEPS - AVAILABLE TO YOUR CHILD.

Steps is an internationally recognised programme which is used in over 700 schools throughout New Zealand. Steps is a research based literacy programme. It is non age specific, which means anyone regardless of age and ability can be catered for.

Aims of the programme are to strengthen:

- letter/sound correspondence
- Processing skills with sounds and sound patterns
- Rapid whole word recognition
- Spelling accuracy

You can purchase Web Steps yourself online for your child at \$80. However, Learning Staircase who manage the Steps programme provide a less expensive option through your child's school. We can register your child for Web Steps at a cost of \$15.00 per student. Websteps allows students to access the programme on any device.

Thank you for encouraging your child to take pride in their appearance by wearing our correct school uniform. The children looked great on their first day back!! We remind parents about the following:

- Plain white or navy socks only for the girls
- Plain navy socks for the boys
- No coloured items such as t-shirts or leggings to be worn underneath polo shirts, dresses or skirts.
- Canterbury trackpants or shorts are **NOT** part of our uniform and therefore must not be worn at school.
- Regulation school hat must be worn. This is either the new labelled hat or the plain navy brimmed hat.
- Shoes – black, brown or navy sandals or shoes, track shoes in colours that complement our uniform. We have asked for a common sense approach to footwear so no jandals, plastic shoes, shoes with heels or highly coloured shoes or boots please.
- It is vital that every item of clothing is named. Labels or special pens can be ordered through the uniform service.

## BOARD OF TRUSTEE ELECTIONS

The Board are preparing for the upcoming Triennial BoT elections. The NZSTA encourages parent and whanau participation on school boards in order to help shape and support the education of their children. The Korari Programme is available for anyone interested in finding out about standing for the school board elections and having a say in the education of their children. Resources available are:

- **Korari:** a programme (workshop) that provides you with governance training to help you understand the role of school boards of trustees. Workshops for Korari will be held in March/April this year. Please see poster in Community Notices section.
- **Korari form:** NZSTA will support anyone who advises us they are interested in becoming a trustee, by way of the workshops but also providing access to their Learning Management System where online modules re. school governance, student achievement etc. can be completed. (school office)
- **Community member guide to the role of the board of trustees:** This explains a lot of commonly asked questions and information about becoming a trustee.

## FINANCES

- School Costs will be billed to your child's account. A statement will be sent out monthly that shows the items billed and payments made.
- Please pay by internet banking (03-1735-0004162-000). Please put name and what it relates to as the reference and/or e-mail Tegan to advise. If you are unable to pay by internet banking, payment can be made by cash or cheque. Please place cash/cheque in a named envelope and specify what the payment is for on the envelope. The envelope can be given to the classroom teacher to come to the office in the purple bag. If dropping the envelope to the office, please put envelope in the post-it slot. **We do not have eftpos.**
- **We have limited cash, so please endeavour to pay the exact amount of cash.**
- **You can pay regular amounts to cover costs e.g \$5 per week if NE-Y2, \$10 per week if Y3&4, \$15 Y5&6.**
- Should you require assistance to meet school costs, please contact the principal or Tegan in the office as there is assistance that is available.

## AFTER-SCHOOL CARE PROGRAMME

- A reminder that casual bookings need to be paid for in the week of the booking.
- Please note the following:
  - Ensure you see Sue or Tracey to sign your child out when picking them up.
  - make sure you let the office know if your child is not attending Afterschool Care as there is a waiting list.
  - Remind your child that they need to be checked in by Sue or Tracey before going out to play
  - Provide enough food for your child for afternoon tea.


