This is our final newsletter for 2020 and we can reflect on a year like no other we have ever experienced in our lives. School years go by in a blur at the best of times, but it's hard to fully grasp how much has happened in the past 12 months. COVID-19 has been, and continues to be, a huge challenge for the world. As I continue to watch what is happening internationally, I feel very lucky to be in Cromwell and to be part of a such a wonderful school community. Thank you for all you have contributed as partners in home learning programmes during Lockdown and for supporting your children back to school so well in Level 2. I would also like to acknowledge our wonderful staff for their professionalism, for caring about ākonga and our whānau and for their seemingly unlimited energy, dedication and commitment to doing the very best for their students. Much has been expected of our workforce/staff and as always, much has been delivered.

Despite the COVID interrupted year, we have still managed to organise activities which have been 2020 highlights for the children – Camp Columba, Dunedin Camp, Te Rau Aroha Marae Trip, Highlands Year 6 Challenge, Year 6 Bungy Trip, Virtual Polyfest and Chess Nationals. 2020 - THE YEAR OF CONTINUING GROWTH

This year has been another year of significant changes, mostly linked to our continued growth. Our roll has grown to 364 and this has meant we have had to review many of our school systems and processes to ensure that what we are doing is effective and appropriate for a school of our size.

- The contract for multipurpose building project has been signed and awarded to Ultraspan which is fantastic progress. Construction is scheduled to commence in January 2021. This project is an example of the importance of having a long term vision and strategic planning goal which has enabled us to raise the significant funds required to achieve this goal. We appreciate the patience of our community who have been raising funds for this project for several years. Between school fundraising from three previous school fairs and a significant amount of community trusts funding, we are now financially able to commit to this project for the benefit of the children now and in the future.
- We have employed additional staff members in response to our growing roll.
- We have had to relinquish the use of the Junction Suite as our school library again this year, as currently we have 55 Years 3/4 students based in there.
- Lots of changes to adapt to, but the one thing that has not changed is that we

continue to do the best we can do for our students. We encourage the children to be the best learners and people they can be, and the staff work tirelessly to ensure that all students receive the best possible learning opportunities in order to ensure individual success.

2020 STUDENT COUNCIL END OF YEAR MESSAGE

Thanks everyone for supporting us this year. We raised \$880 for the Southland Charity Hospital and giant outdoor games for school. Today we collected approximately 700 cans for the Cromwell Food Bank in our annual “Christmas Carols for Cans” partnership with ECE. Thanks to our choir and guitarists who provided the entertainment. We have really enjoyed providing fun games for everyone on Monday lunchtimes and representing our classes. We hope that we have helped to “make a difference” at school. Even though we ran a very small, though highly dedicated team this year, with the help of our wonderful parent community and Mr Dave, we still managed to pull off a fantastic Halloween disco, reinstate fortnightly sausage sizzles and find a new Sushi Supplier (Thank you Highlands and Kumi's Sushi). We also continued to be supported by Jayne and Scott from Subway each week school was open.

This year SOKs (thanks to all your help) was able to donate to the school-








YEAR 6 TRANSITION FUN!!!
