PAID UNION MEETINGS FOR TEACHERS

Our teachers who are members of NZEI Te Riu Roa will be attending a paid union meeting on either Monday 28th June or Tuesday 29th June. The purpose of these meetings is for teachers to discuss the priorities for the renegotiation of their collective agreement in 2022. Issues being discussed, such as school staffing levels, directly impact on the education of your children. These meetings are a critical component of the negotiation process and it is the legal right of all members to attend a meeting and have their say. While there will be some impact on the usual school programme on the dates listed above, we have adjusted the programme to minimise disruption, and the school will remain open.

STAFF NEWS

- Kate Nicholson, release teacher in Ako, is leaving us at Queen's Birthday Weekend to take up a fulltime teaching position at The Terrace School in Alexandra. Kate completed her third year teacher training placement in Ako in 2020 and has been a much valued member of the Ako Team since then. WINTER WEATHER REMINDERS

We remind families of the following procedures if the weather is if concern:

- School closure decisions are made in conjunction with Cromwell College and Goldfields School. Tony Streeter (Cromwell Bus Controller) makes the decision for early or late departures of buses and he contacts the radio station.
- Details of school late starts or closures will be broadcast on More FM 94.3fm or 531am, as early as possible.



- School Costs will be billed to your child's account. A statement will be sent out monthly that shows the items billed and payments made.
- Please pay by internet banking (03-1735-0004162-000). Please put name and what it relates to as the reference and/or e-mail Tegan to advise. If you are unable to pay by internet banking, payment can be made by cash or cheque. Please place cash/cheque in a named envelope and specify what the payment is for on the envelope. The envelope can be given to the classroom teacher to come to the office in the purple bag. If dropping the envelope to the office, please put envelope in the post-it slot. We do not have eftpos.
- We have limited cash, so please endeavour to pay the exact amount of cash.
- You can pay regular amounts to cover costs e.g \$5 per week if NE-Y2, \$10 per week if Y3&4, \$15 Y5&6.
