2019 MID YEAR REPORTING, STUDENT PROFILES & LEARNING PARTNERSHIP MEETINGS

Over the past 18 months we have been reviewing current trends in reporting across the country and examining our own practices. Last year, parents' opinions were surveyed as part of this process. Digital communication tools like Seesaw have also been trialled in many classrooms across the school to which parents have responded positively. We plan to investigate other digital tools which may improve this process even more.

Feedback tells us that reports should continue to inform parents about children's progress; achievement in reading, writing and maths in relation to NZC expectations; social - emotional skills and attitudes to learning; as well as other significant achievements and interests at school.

As yet, we are not ready to completely revise our reporting process. We hope to have further conversations with parents later in the year before making some significant changes. For mid-year reporting this year there will only be a couple of changes to the current format. These are outlined below

1. We have included the global competencies (sometimes called the 6Cs) which encompass all the "soft" skills that a 21st Century learner needs to develop to succeed in a fast paced digital economy.
2. We have replaced the dot continuum (as pictured below) with a simple statement to clearly show if a child **needs support, is achieving at the expected level or is achieving above expectation**. The dot continuum was an attempt to simplify information contained in classroom tracking and progress records to show a child's progress. Teacher judgements about dot placement were fraught with difficulty, as each dot position had to represent a range of levels across three very different subjects.

Teachers now believe parents will gain a far more accurate picture of their child's progress and learning by sharing the detailed tracking and progress information we have in our classrooms. For Hārewa and Kārearea Teams this information is in students' Learning Progress Folders and for the Ako Team this is in their Digital Learning Progress Folders.

3. Our one page report will come out at the end of this term. At the beginning of Term 3 parents will be invited to come in for a Learning Partnership Meeting to view and discuss children's detailed progress tracking with teachers. Parents will have the opportunity to take tracking information home and refer to it. We have this tracking information readily available to parents at any time.

Please let us know if you have any questions about reporting for mid-year. Also if you would like to be involved in a parent forum later in the year when we start revamping our reporting systems more thoroughly.

CROMWELL COMMUNITY OF LEARNING (COL) 2019 PROGRESS UPDATE

- The Cromwell CoL “Te Kāhui Ako o ngā awanui” is now in its second year of collaboration and is making great progress.
- Our Kāhui Ako includes all three schools and six Early Childhood Centres in Cromwell. The School Principals and Centre Managers/Head Teachers work together as the CoL Leadership Team.
- Our Cromwell Community of Learning (CoL) is called “*Te Kāhui Ako o ngā Awanui*” the community of learning of the big rivers.
- Our vision for Te Kāhui Ako o ngā Awanui is “*learning together to make a difference*”.
- Our CoL whakatauki is “*Ko te ahurei o te akonga arahina o tatou mahi*” – let the uniqueness of the learner guide our work.
- Our CoL values are - Rawe (personal excellence), Manaakitanga (care and respect), Ako Whanaungatanga (learning partnerships, lifelong learning, Maia (courage), Aumangea (resilience).
- The Leadership Team meets twice per term with a focus on growing leadership capacity and capability, learning how to lead change, connecting with learning partners such as Otago Polytech, REAP, CODC and other Kāhui Ako Lead Principals and developing new systems including protocols for information sharing and creating new resources. One example of this is our CromWELLBEING Model which is now visible in every school or centre and is actively being used to track all that our CoL is doing to help build a “well community”.
- Two special groups have already been formed to target areas of focus – ICT Lead Team is working on a professional development and learning project to ensure we are ready to fully implement the new Digital Technologies Curriculum by 2020. This work is being integrated with hands-on design learning tasks linked to using the new devices and gadgets we have been able to purchase with the \$300,000 Innovative Project Grant from the Otago Community Trust. The Early Oral Language and Literacy Group formed to deliver a programme of professional learning and development aimed at improving the oral literacy levels of pre-schoolers. This work is being funded by a MOE grant of \$11,000 for ECE involvement in CoLs.
- CoL Achievement Challenges we are developing are in the areas of wellbeing, learning success for all and community learning partnerships. Once these have been approved we will receive a MOE staffing entitlement that will allow us to appoint two across school teachers (AST) who will focus on helping us achieve the targets we have identified.
- The CoL Whānau Group was formed in 2018 following a full community consultation process that clearly indicated that people wanted to connect with others in Cromwell who are keen to develop and celebrate the cultural dimensions of our CoL. Our Whānau Group picnic was held in Term 1 and this term we are having a Matariki Celebration with Kapa Haka performances and local stories being shared by our Ngai Tahu Iwi Kaumatua Darren Rewi. This event is being held on Wednesday 26 June.

- By sharing resources and professional learning and development opportunities, developing a shared understanding of effective teaching practices and ensuring children have seamless transitions from centres to schools and college, we are committed to ensuring that Cromwell students will have opportunities to achieve their best possible educational outcomes.
